## Program

Everyone enjoyed the trip to the Milwaukee Art Museum and the Ashcan Eight Exhibit. Exhibit pieces were part of the Art Museum's permanent collection, since it is becoming cost prohibitive to host exhibits from other museums. Mary recommends a book by the artist, Robert Henri, *Art Spirit*. She will work to set aside an amount of money for future trips and asks to give her any ideas for travel to future shows.

Members talked about their favorite tools and techniques. For oil painters Zinzar Bin was a suitable gesso substitute and durable for application on wood. Carey Hunkel, wanting quick drying oil paint, experimented with heat set oils, baked in an oven. Valerie Mangion suggested she try mixing Liquin into her oils for quicker drying. Valerie uses Gamblin oil paint professional grade and cleans brushes with baby oil. Kaaren Oreck suggested Carey put down the initial painting in acrylic to save time with oils. Paula Schiller puts chalk in acrylic gesso to achieve an unequal surface. However, more oil paint is needed because of absorbency. Mary Tilton is using a palette knife to deliver watercolor to paper and likes the spontaneity. Julie Raasch shared photos of her textured hammers, anvil,

torch and a recently completed piece. Emily Fritts uses scanned images of 3-D objects in her mixed media. Jayne Reid Jackson recently purchased a piece of film, which she uses to filter her work light in order to better see the mezzotint she is working on. Merikay Payne is a fan of transparent oil-based ink to make other inks transparent and accepting of other oil based media.
